

Home Lifts and Lifts.

The below should provide a quick overview of the main Differences and Similarities between Home Lifts (Slow Speed) and Lifts (Normal Speed).

Home Lift

- Rated speed does not exceed 0.15m/s (very slow speed, consequently it is not ideal nor intended to service multiple floors in a block of apartments as it would take nearly 2 minutes to reach 4th floor from ground level);
- Registration with MCCA is not required;
- CE Marked (Declaration Of Conformity required);
- Preventive Inspection and Thorough examinations reports need not be sent to MCCA.
- Falls under the scope of the Machinery Directive 2006/42/EC.

Passenger Lifts

- Rated speed exceeds 0.15m/s and (Normal Speed for passenger lifts is between 0.15m/s - 6.5m/s);
- Registration with MCCA is required;
- CE Marked (Declaration Of Conformity required);
- Preventive Inspections and Thorough Examinations reports need to be sent to the MCCA / OHS as applicable ,
- Falls under the Lifts Directive 2014/33/EU.
